

Asia Pacific Sustainable Development Journal (APSDJ) Editorial Policy

Asia Pacific Sustainable Development Journal (APSDJ) is published following the [Publications Policy of the United Nations](#), approved by the UN General Assembly. It is published under the authority of the UN Publications Board. The readership of United Nations publications ranges widely, covering, for example, development planners, statisticians, demographers, energy and water specialists and development assistance personnel, as well as the general public.

While APSDJ strives to fill the needs of its readership and to promote the principles and purposes of the Organization, it emphasizes high standard of analysis or data. In order to be issued as a publication of the United Nations, materials should:

- a) Promote the principles and purposes of the United Nations;
- b) Contribute directly to the achievement of one or more of the programme budget objectives of the subprogramme under which it is prepared;
- c) Be timely;
- d) Respond to an identified demand from a clearly defined target readership;
- e) Reach a standard of intellectual endeavour that reflects credit on the United Nations;
- f) Be prepared in a clear and concise style appropriate to the readership for which the publication is intended;
- g) Not substantially duplicate material that has already been published and is readily available.

Thus, the main objectives of APSDJ's editorial policy are to:

- Maintain the Journal's **high academic/scholarly standards** by:
 - subjecting submissions to a double-blind refereeing process;
 - selecting papers purely on merit basis;
 - appointing individual experts to the Editorial and Advisory Boards with clear terms of reference.
- Uphold the Journal's **ethical standards** by requiring authors to:
 - submit their data for verifications and replications to interested readers upon request;
 - sign a declaration confirming that their articles are original and have not been published in any other publications or refereed journal(s);
 - declare any possible conflict of interest, e.g., funding sources of their research;
 - appropriately acknowledge individuals and/or organizations who provided comments/support;
 - obtain written permission for using third-party material, e.g., figures, tables, published elsewhere.
- Promote **accessibility, diversity, equity, and inclusivity** by:
 - allowing free downloads of its contents;
 - not charging authors submission or subscription fees;
 - accepting papers from authors regardless of their ethnic or national identity;
 - encouraging submissions from authors in countries in special situations, i.e., least developed countries, landlocked developing countries and small island developing States;
 - providing capacity development services to 'early career researchers' by giving constructive feedback and mentoring them;
 - archiving all past issues.
- Preserve **transparency** by following the Principles of Transparency and Best Practices in Scholarly Publishing as collaboratively developed by the [Committee on Publication Ethics \(COPE\)](#), and clearly stating in the journal's website:

- editorial policies, aims and objectives and submission guidelines;
- types of manuscripts the journal will consider for publication;
- complaints and conflict of interest resolution procedures;
- copyrights concerning reproduction and uses of articles.
- Maintain **regularity and timeliness** by:
 - publishing its two issues in May and November of each year;
 - requiring reviewers to submit their reports within a stipulated deadline;
 - informing authors of any delay.
- Resolve **complaints and appeals** by:
 - following the [UN's Ethical code of conduct](#)
 - setting up an independent body of experts;
 - following COPE's guidance/ flow-charts.

Author services

- UN-ESCAP, the publisher, will provide copy-editing services free of charge
- The Editors will provide constructive feedback to authors
- The Editors will mentor 'early career researchers' for developing their research and writing capabilities
- There is no article transfer service, i.e., the Managing Editor will not direct the article to any other journal.

Submission/author fees

- There are no submission fees, publication fees or page charges.
- All publication costs are borne by the United Nations Economic and Social Commission for Asia and the Pacific (UN-ESCAP) from its regular budget

Advertising

- APSDJ does not carry any advertisement which is commercial in nature
- APSDJ also does not place paid advertisement of itself in other journals
- APSDJ may carry "Call for Papers" from other journals when it is mutually agreed to carry its "Call for Papers" by those journals

Copyright

- United Nations is the holder of APSDJ's copyright, while individual authors retain copyright of their articles.
- APSDJ contents may be reproduced in whole or in part for educational or non-profit purposes without special permission from the copyright holder, provided that the source is duly acknowledged.
