Statement:

- Thank you Chair / Madam Chair for giving me a floor.
- First of all, Indonesia highly appreciates all the efforts of The Secretariat and The Bureau of the Committee on Statistics for the development of the monitoring and evaluation framework for action and guidelines.
- Indonesia has strived to fulfill the commitments as specified in The Collective Vision and Framework for action. In this opportunity I would like to highlight some of the progress on our commitments as follows:

1. In order to enhance user engagement, according to our Statistics Act, Statistical Society Forum plays the role of the high-level Advisory body to represent the government, businesses, academia, practitioners, and communities. Its functions have actively exercised periodically to provide inputs and directions for the national statistics development.

However, the development of National Strategies for the Development of Statistics (NSDS) is facing a long process in legislation.

2. Indonesia has established One Data Policy that aims at improving national data governance, data quality, data integration and accessibility, and data transparency for decisions and policy making. The implementation of the policy is to fulfil our commitments in quality assurance, statistical integration, and statistical business process modernization.

The role of Statistics Indonesia in the policy is to provide advisory and capacity building services to Ministries and Local Governments in order to strengthen their statistical capability of modernizing statistical business process.

Meanwhile, lack of human resources capacity in statistics and statistical infrastructure capability become the major problems.

In order to accelerate the development of national statistical capabilities, Statistics Indonesia has initiated the development of The National Statistical Infrastructure System that can be utilized by other Ministries and Local Governments in implementing standardized statistical business process.

- In order to achieve all commitments together with all countries, collaborative actions among countries are extremely important. Indonesia is very welcome to share knowledge and experiences as well as to exchange experts among other countries.
